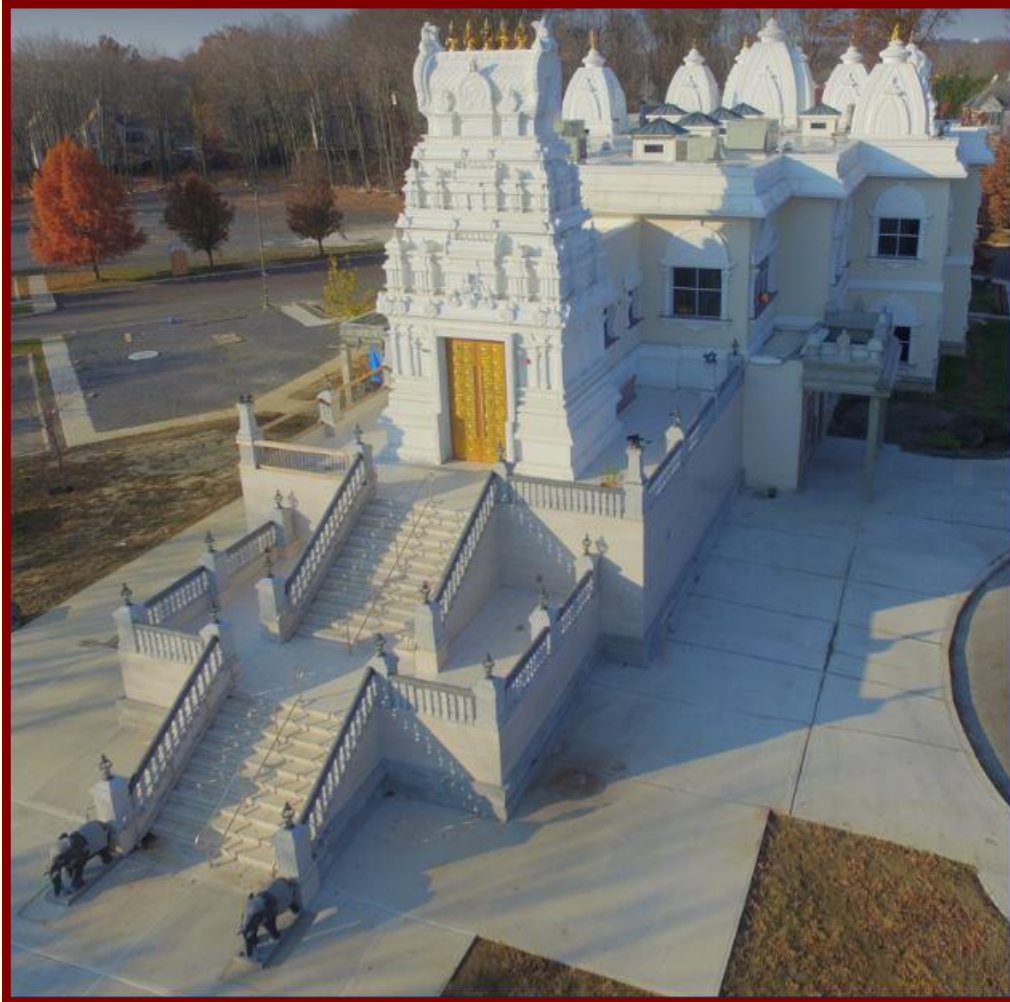

The 2023 Primary Election in Montgomery County will take place on Tuesday, May 16th, 2023. As citizens of this wonderful democracy, we are fortunate to have the privilege of casting our ballots and selecting/ electing candidates of our choice. Voters have several options to cast their ballot:

- Vote In Person at a polling location
- Vote by Absentee Ballot
- Vote by Mail-In Ballot

No matter which option you choose, you must be registered to vote by Monday, May 1, 2023. Please make sure you are registered to vote and vote for the candidate that best addresses your needs.

Please remember that the primary election allows you to vote only for the candidate of the party you are registered with. Voting in primary election is important to have a candidate of your choice for the final general election.

Religious Committee - Hindu

January 2023

On the 1st of January, New Year's Day the temple was open all day long. After the Sunday morning abhishek, Srinivas Kalyanam was celebrated with great pomp as is the New Year's day tradition. Satyanarayan Puja was also performed in the evening for New Year's day. On January 2, Ekadasi day was the occasion of Vaikunth Ekadasi. Vaikuntha Dwara puja was performed in the morning and Suprabhatam was also chanted by the priests and devotees.

On Friday, January 13 Andal/Goda Kalyanam was performed on the temple floor. The function was well attended by devotees. Bhogi/Lohri was also celebrated on January 13. Devotees danced around the Lohri bonfire in the temple compound.

Vasant panchami was on the 25th of January and Saraswati Puja was performed on the temple floor where devotees, including children could participate.

Some of the other notable pujas performed in January were the chanting of Thiruppavai and Thiruvembavai on Monday's and the chanting of Thiruppavai on Saturday's by Tamil devotees during the Dhanur Masam. Ayyappa Mandala puja was performed on Saturday, January 7. Sunderkand parayan was performed on January 8.



February 2023



In the month of February we had two major events. Thaipoosam on Feb 4th and Maha Shivratri from 13 to 18th . It is believed that on this day , Goddess Parvathi presented a lance to Lord Muruga to kill the demon army of Tarakasura. Thaipoosam is a celebration of the victory of good over evil. This event was well attended by devotees, they carried milk pots and kavadi around the temple in procession, followed by Lord Murugan abhishek chanting the

Kandar shasti kavacham (kavacham means to shield from all sufferings and agony).

Religious Committee - Hindu

Maha Shivratri was celebrated from 13th to 18th. Priests chanted Maha Mrityunjaya puja for 7 days and they did a havan on 19th. Maha Shivratri program was well attended and the temple hall was full till midnight. Kids and devotees sang bhajans and it was a wonderful spiritual experience for everyone.

March 2023

The month of March began with an auspicious Satyanarayan puja on the full moon day. The puja is conducted to seek Lord's blessings on the occasion of Holika Dahan.

Yugadi is the first day of Chaitra masam and was celebrated on March 6th. It marks the beginning of the new year. As part of Yugadi celebration, Padmavati Kalyanam took place amidst chants of mantras and devotees singing praises of the Lord.

The festival of Gangaur took place on March 19th and is celebrated to honor love and marriage. In Rajasthani culture, married women worship Ma Gauri for good health and longevity of their husband. The Temple was vibrating with greetings of Khama Gani, the colorful safas adorned by men folk. Women dressed in traditional Rajasthani attires and worshipping together was a sight not to be missed.

On March 26th, we had Amritvani. Amritvani is a collection of verses compiled by Satyanand Ji Maharaj in praise of Lord Rama. Jaipal Rathi ji & the devotees together recited Amritvani to celebrate Ram Navami.

Then from March 22nd to March 29th came Chaitra Navaratri. Daily Durga/ Chandi Path by priests and devotees on the occasion of Chaitra Navaratri was nectar to the ears. On the 8th day, Durga Ashtami Havan was held in the tent. In the evening, Durga Mata's devotees performed Homam. The flames from the havan kunds while the sun was setting and the divine smell from burning of Aahuti samagri filled the Temple's entire premises with divinity.

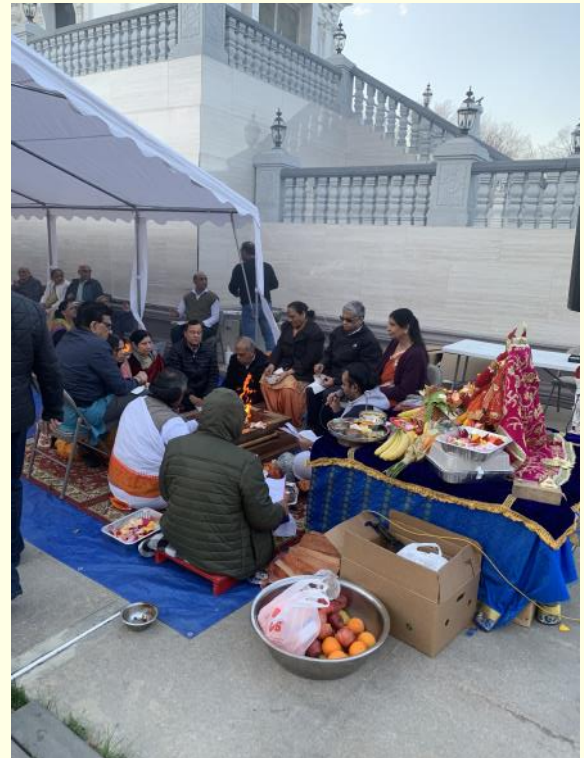
Lastly, March 30th marked the end of Chaitra masam. Kalyanotsavam literally means Marriage Festival. Kalyanotsavam is the re-depiction of the celestial marriage of Seeta Ji and Lord Rama. This year, for the first time ever in Bharatiya Temple, we celebrated Sita - Ram Kalyanam. The turnout of devotees was overwhelming. Devotees brought in a variety of prasadam, which was distributed to all.

Regular religious events like Sankashti, Sunderkand Recital, Ayyappa and Murugan Puja's were performed monthly / bimonthly as per the calendar.

Bharatiya Temple Celebrates Gangaur and Millet Festivals

Bharatiya Temple celebrated Rajasthani Gangaur Festival and Millet Festival at large scale with Govt of India officials area on March 19, 2023.

Bharatiya temple has been celebrating Gangaur Festival for the past 15 years. Gangaur is and one of the most important and colorful festivals of the people of Rajasthan and is observed throughout the state with great fervor and devotion by womenfolk who worship Goddess Gauri - the wife of Lord Shiva - during the month of Chaitra (March – April). It is the celebration of spring harvest, marital fidelity, conjugal blessedness and childbearing.



This year the Rajasthani community took the celebrations to another level with the support and coordination with Philadelphia Rajasthani Mandal (PARAM). The Govt of India official, Dr. Varun Jeph, Deputy Council General from Consulate General of India from New York, and Mr. Prem Bhandari, president of Rajasthan Association of North America (RANA) honored the festival by their gracious presence and blessings.



The celebration was even more special this year as the Bharatiya Temple promoted the Govt of India Millet Initiative. On the appeal of the current Indian Prime Minister to bring awareness about millets, a few locals and some Rajasthani-American children presented posters and talked about the importance of millets in our regular diet. In doing so, they impressed Dr. Varun Jeph and Mr. Prem Bhandari with their knowledge, such as the ability for millets to prevent various human diseases.

About 300-400 Rajasthani family members celebrated the Gangaur Festival with a traditional Rajasthani style welcome followed by a Gangaur Pooja and Procession. Many enjoyed the traditional cultural activities, performances, local and folk dances, and took a pledge in which they dedicated their Mondays to use millets in their foods. The festival graciously ended by serving Rajasthani traditional food: Daal, Baati, Gatta sabzi, Churma, and freshly cooked millet dishes.

HHS team organized a Blood Drive at Bharatiya Temple on 25 Feb 2023. The team of volunteers made efforts to call donors and fill up all the slots available. We had a great donor turnout from both Temple devotees and mainstream community. A very big THANK YOU to all the donors, we were able to collect 24 lifesaving pints of blood. Each pint of blood donated can potentially save 3 lives and in total this donation could save 72 lives. Every day, blood donors help patients of all ages. Blood transfusions are given to patients in a wide range of circumstances, including serious injuries (such as in a car crash), burns, surgeries, childbirth, anemia, blood disorders, cancer treatments, and many others. In fact, every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood.

Bharatiya Vidyalaya

161 students have registered for the academic year 2022-23 of the Bharatiya Vidyalaya program (August 2022 thru May 2023), the 18th year of successful operation of Bharatiya Vidyalaya. To avoid overcrowding especially in view of the COVID situation, further registrations were stopped.

A Typical Bharatiya Vidyalaya Sunday

Students start their Sunday at 9:20 AM with Yoga conducted by experienced volunteers, followed by musical chanting, prayers and Bhagavad Geeta chanting. Parents are encouraged to join morning assembly along with students.

At 10 AM, students attend Hindu Religion classes as per their age group. Jain students attend Jain Religion classes. On select Sundays, Culture classes are scheduled instead. The schedule for the year was finalized in advance.

At 11 AM, students attend one of the seven language classes as per their selection of language. Gujarati, Hindi, Sanskrit, Tamil and Telugu language classes are further split into 2 or 3 sections based on proficiency of students. Kannada and Marathi have one section each. On select Sundays, Culture classes are scheduled instead of Language.

At noon, students attend Aarati upstairs. After the Aarati, interested students join one of the two streams scheduled for 25 minutes each – music (group singing) stream and Bhagavad Geeta chanting stream.

Overall, students are enthusiastic about the program provided by volunteers. Students find the Bharatiya Vidyalaya program engaging and beneficial.

From 10 AM to 12 PM, interested parents join the discussion group for Bhagavad Geeta and other scriptures. Volunteers who are knowledgeable on the subject moderate the group. The group studied Bhagavad Geeta chapter 1 during Q1 2023. The Chapter 1 helps one understand how emotions can get in the way of us doing our duty.

Volunteers

Bharatiya Vidyalaya program is run by over 55 teaching volunteers and 10 non-teaching volunteers. All volunteers maintain their compliance required for volunteering as per the Law in Pennsylvania. Volunteers teach Hindu and Jain religion, Indian Culture and seven Indian languages. Additionally, they teach Yoga, music (group chanting and

group singing), prayers in Sanskrit and Bhagavad Geeta chanting.

New parents and other community members are encouraged to join the team of volunteers. New volunteers are paired up with experienced volunteers during their first year.

Senior Students

As part of the Senior Student program, 9th grade and above students are provided an opportunity to get trained for teaching by adult volunteers. Seven students are currently getting the training as Senior Students. They help with teaching one subject (for example, Religion) and attend classes for the other two subjects as students (in this example, Culture and Language).

Library

Bharatiya Vidyalaya library was shut down for two years during the COVID period. A dedicated group of volunteers reactivated the library in October. Parents can borrow books from the library for their family.

Expenses

Bharatiya Vidyalaya volunteers are extremely conservative with expenses. The only significant expense is the cost of text books, which is a very small proportion of the fee parents pay as donation. Volunteers and parents donate generously to cover most, if not all expenses for occasional food sponsoring, web site hosting and other expenses required for running the Vidyalaya activities.

Additional Programs during Q1-2023

January 29th: Ma Saraswati Puja

A special Ma Saraswati Puja was performed for students from 11 AM to 12 PM upstairs in the Temple. Students came dressed up in traditional Indian outfits. Students brought a notebook. Priests gave a mantra in the Puja. Students wrote the mantra in their notebook

Sunday February 5th: Program in remembrance of Saradaji and Mukeshbhai Dave

Students and parents attended Maha Siva Ratri Mahotsava. Students sang bhajans in praise of Lord Siva.

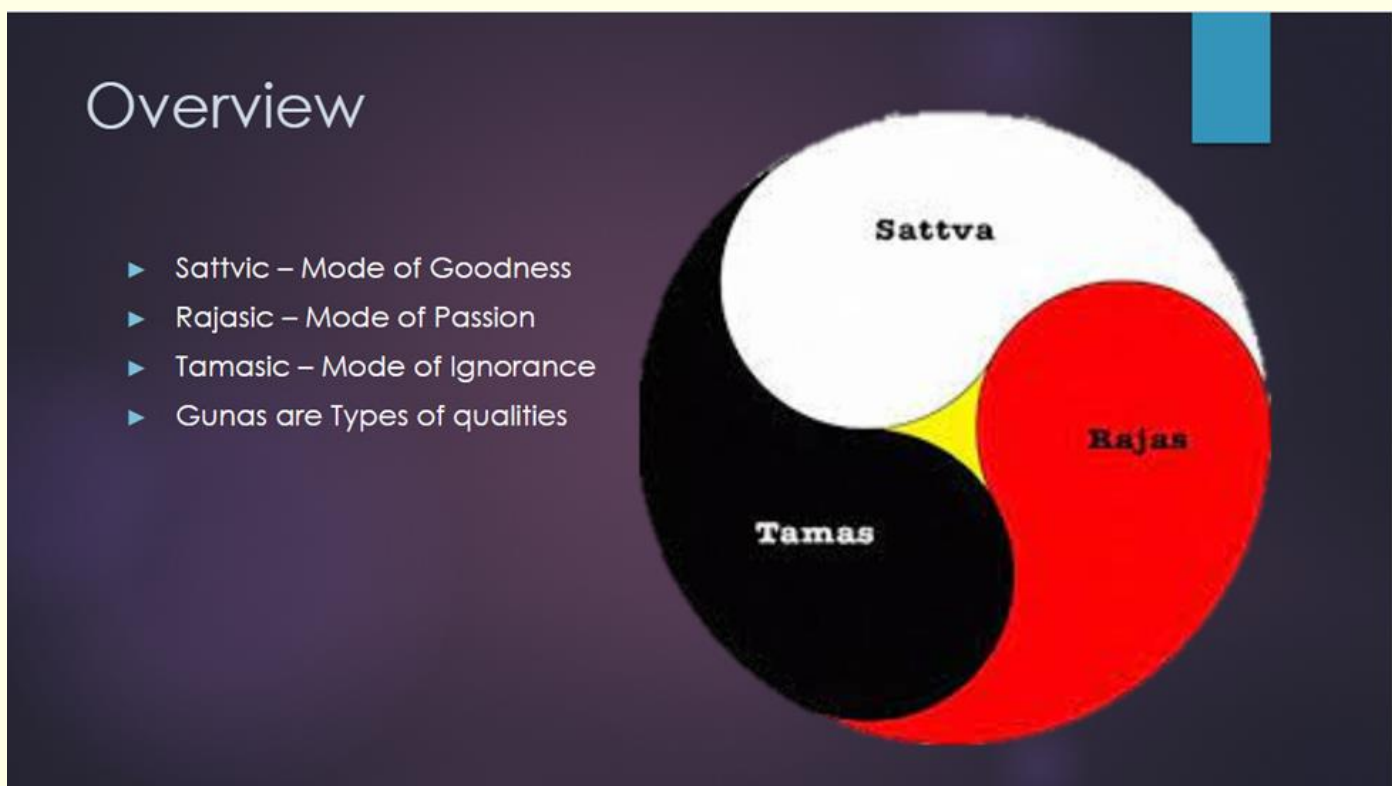
March 12th: Holi Mahotsav
