October 2023

The month of October started with the Mahalaya Shradh parv. On Mahalaya Amavasya which is the last day of the parv a "Samuhik Shradh Puja" was conducted by the priests. Sharad Navaratri was celebrated in BTI from the 15th to the 23rd of October, followed by Dussera on the 24th. The temple was decorated beautifully by volunteers and devotees. Upstairs in the temple a beautiful mandap was made with Durga mata's utsav murti. A typical South India Golu display was also created on either side of the mandap. On the 15th to mark the start of Sharad Navaratri a Durgama Abhishekam was performed along with Ghata Sthapana. A procession was also held around the temple with Dhol Tasha and dancing. In the auditorium downstairs, another mandap was built on the stage around a beautiful Durga Mata utsav murti, with lots of decorations around it. Chandi path was chanted by devotees on all days of the navaratri. Also each day a Durga Vishesh puja was held that devotees could sponsor and perform. Vishwambari Stuti was chanted every evening. On Friday, 20th of October a Lalitha Trishati Pushpa Archana puja was conducted in the evening. On Saturday, the 21st Navaratri celebrations started with Sangeet Seva. In the afternoon a Maha Bhagavati Puja was performed after which a Mata Ki Chowki was conducted. Sunday, the 22nd was Durga Ashtami and a Durga Ashtami Havan was conducted by the temple priests with devotee participation. 23rd was Maha Navami, the last day of the Sharad Navaratri. The next day, October 24th was Vijaya Dasami or Dussera. A Mata Saraswati puja was performed in the evening ending with Durga mata and Sarva Devata aarti. The Dussera celebrations ended with Ravan dahan in the temple compound attended in large numbers.

October 27th, was Sharad Poornima day and a Satyanarayan Puja was performed in the temple that devotees also performed. Karwa Chauth was celebrated by the women devotees in the temple on Tuesday, October 31st.

November 2023 (Kartik Masam)

In Hindu Panchang, there are two solstices in a year, which are known as Uttarayan (summer solstice) and Dakshinayan (winter solstice). Both these periods span over six months each. Dakshinayana is for purification, while Uttarayana is for enlightenment.

Kartik Masam or Kartik month (November) is part of Dakshinayana and is considered the holiest among Hindus. During this month, Lord Vishnu, Lord Shiv, and other Devatas descend on the earth to visit sacred rivers. Devotees all over India visit temples during this month.

Bharatiya Temple is a platform where communities of Indian origin come together to celebrate all festivals.

Diwali Celebrations over 5 Days

On the auspicious occasion of Diwali (also known as Deepavali), the festival of lights, all deities in the Temple were decorated with new beautiful gold-plated silver mukuts (crowns). Devotees and decoration (Alankar) sponsors participated in the auspicious ceremony. Having the Darshan (viewing) of the decorated deities was a great feeling, which cannot be described in words.

On the occasion of Diwali, devotees had Mahotsava (grand celebration) over five days in Bharatiya Temple. The Temple was beautifully decorated during these five days. Joyous visitors were seen in the Temple, highlighting the effect of the effort volunteers put in for organizing and celebrating festivals in the Temple.

The four priests beautifully conducted pujas (prayers) starting from Dhanteras (the thirteenth day in honor of Lord Dhanvantri).

On Kali Chaudas, the fourteenth day of the lunar phase, a large number of devotees chanted Sunderkand in the Temple.

On the day of Diwali, devotees flocked to Bharatiya Temple to seek God's blessings. The day began with Shri Lakshmi Narayan Abhishekam followed by Asht Lakshmi Havan. The Asht Lakshmi Havan was performed for the first time in the Temple and was well attended by sponsors and other devotees. In the evening, the Temple organized fireworks and distributed food prasad to about 800 devotees who attended the celebration.

Nutan Varsha (new year) day, the day after Diwali, saw a large number of devotees visiting the Temple dressed in new clothes.

Diwali celebrations culminated with the Annakut (ground grains). This is one day when a very large variety of sweets and savories are offered to Lord Krishna. Continuous Bhajans by devotees on the rhythmic beats of dhol (drum)/manjira (percussion) created a

divine atmosphere in the Temple.

Chhath Parva

Chhath Parva, also known as Surya Shashti or the sixth day of the Kartik month, is celebrated during the third week of November. On this day, devotees perform puja of "Surya Dev" (the sun god). The festival is popularly celebrated in Bihar, Jharkhand, and eastern UP. As per the tradition, devotees originally from these regions gathered in Bharatiya Temple to pray to the Sun god when it was rising in the east in the early morning hours, braving the cold weather, and again when the sun was setting in the west. This is an example of how devotion prevails over any physical discomfort.

Tulasi Vivah

Tulasi Vivah is celebrated to mark the wedding of Tulasi ji with Lord Vishnu. Lord Vishnu blessed Tulasi ji to take the form of the Tulasi plant, the holy basil, who would be worshipped by devotees in all times to come. The wedding was observed in great style by our priests and was well attended by devotees.

Mandala Puja

The month of November sees the beginning of Mandala puja. As per the tradition, Lord Ayyappa devotees dressed in black attire visit the Temple. The Temple floor was beautifully decorated with lamps and resonated as devotees sing Bhajans.

Kartik Purnima

Kartik Purnima is a Hindu, Sikh, and Jain cultural festival that is celebrated on the full moon day of the Hindu month of Kartika. This year, Kartik Purnima falls on November 27th. The day is considered very auspicious to perform Satyanarayan Puja to seek blessings of Lord Narayan. On this day, as per the tradition, devotees lighted hundreds of Deepams (lamps) after sunset and placed them on the front steps of the Temple. The full moon in the sky and hundreds of Deepams on the front steps created a beautiful and serene atmosphere as if heavens and earth were in perfect sync for the celebration.

December 2023

On December 16th, Dhanur month started around 8:30 am with the recital of Sri Venkateshwara Suprabhatam, followed by recital of Tirupalliyezhuchi and Tiruppavai. We repeated this on all Saturdays during the Dhanur month. Every Monday morning around 10:30 am, Tiruvempavai and Tirupalliyezhuchi Parayan was conducted for Lord Shiva. Ayappa Mandala Puja was celebrated every Saturday at 6 PM. Vaikunta Ekadasi was celebrated on 22nd ,Priest did the Dwara puja early morning around 8:30. Doors were opened after the recital , in the evening Gita Jayanthi was celebrated which was well attended. Dec 30th Saturday we did the Vilakku Puja with 18 lamps for Lord Ayappa, with all the flowers , bhajans and a special Chenndai Melam presentation was the highlight of this program which was a tradition in Kerala. During New Year's eve, many kids participated in a bhajan program. New year started with the recital of Suprabhatam, Tiruppavai and Tiruvempavai followed by Srinivasa Kalyaanam and Satyanarayan Puja in the evening. All the deities were adorned with special malas from India. The whole day the temple floor was filled with devotees. Hope this new year brings joy to everyone.





On Nov 14 Jains did New Year Manglik and puja followed by Swamivatsalya in the morning. About 100 devotees attended this event.

On Nov 18 we did Gyaan Pancham Aaradhna in the morning. This day is celebrated as a day to honor knowledge and holy books. Contributions of 150 dollars was given to Jain Pathshala for supporting their activities.

On Nov 23 (Thanksgiving) we did Navkaar Jaap to pray for all turkeys that were slaughtered on that day. Contribution of 200 dollars was donated to Animal Welfare Fund of JAINA Association. Jain Pathshala kids shared a few words about what they were thankful for on Thanksgiving Day.



On Nov 27 we did Kartiki Poonam Aaradhna. This day is also known as the "Jain Festival of Lights" by Jain adherents.

This year Diwali was extra special as new ornamental Gold plated Mukuts also called Alaskaras were placed on all the deities in an elaborate ceremony by all our priests.

Blood Drive:

BCC HHS team organized a Blood Drive at Bharatiya Temple on 25 Nov 2023. We had a total of 18 donations, potentially saving up to 54 lives. The final numbers are slightly lower than expected, but still great considering Thanksgiving break. Thanks to all the volunteers and youth lead Sneha Indrakanti for recruiting donors and making this a successful drive. Great team effort and thanks to BTI/BCC management and BoD for the continued support for these activities.

HHS team organizes 4 Blood Drives throughout the year at Bharatiya Temple. This activity has been ongoing for >10 years and brings local community donors to the Temple. Each pint of blood donated can potentially save 3 lives and in total this donation could save 66 lives. Every day, blood donors help patients of all ages. Blood transfusions are given to patients in a wide range of circumstances, including serious injuries (such as in a car crash), burns, surgeries, childbirth, anemia, blood disorders, cancer treatments, and many others. In fact, every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. The next blood drive is scheduled for 24 Feb 2024 (Saturday) from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Please register using the following link:





The excellent talks were very informative on the topics of different types of women's cancers and how these relate to our diaspora specifically were followed by a very interactive question/answer session. The genetics of cancers was the topic that generated the most discussion. Dr. Dhamankar also recited a lovely poem on women's friendship.











The BCC Women's Group hosted a Mehendi for Karva Chauth event on October 29th accompanied by music, dance, and snacks. The volunteer mehendi artist, Shilpa Goyal, Shreya Salian, Divya Patel, Naina Ingle, and Meenu Sharma along with the women who volunteered to apply mehendi at the event (Sonal Jain, Rimjhim Devgan, and Pooja Jain) did an amazing job. The Women's Group has two book clubs that meet regularly. The Daytime Book Club discussed Hello Beautiful by Ann Napolitano on 19th October over a potluck lunch at the Temple and on 7th December, members went out for a Holiday lunch and discussed The Good Sister by Sally Hepworth.





The Women's Group Evening Book Club led by Poonam Gidwani is generating a lot of interest and during their second meeting held on November 7th Hello Beautiful by Ann Napolitano was discussed. The Evening Book Club will continue to meet during weekday evenings on alternate months.



The Women's Group is planning several events in 2024, the first of which will be **International Women's Day on 9th March 2024**. In addition, we are planning to hold educational talks on women-focused health-related issues and financial management for women. We are also exploring opportunities where our group can volunteer.

We have a very talented and enthusiastic group of women in the Women's Group Committee who are wholehearted committed to the success of the mission of this group.

197 students have registered at the time of this writing for 2023-24 Bharatiya Vidyalaya program (August 27th, 2023 thru May 19th, 2024), the 19th year of successful operation of Bharatiya Vidyalaya. The number of students this year is about the same (97%) as pre-COVID.

A Typical Bharatiya Vidyalaya Sunday

Students start their Sundays at 9:30 AM with Yoga led by experienced volunteers. This is followed by prayers and Bhagavad Geeta chanting. Parents are encouraged to join the morning assembly along with students. Occasionally, a student makes a 5-10 minutes presentation in the morning assembly on a Religion or Culture subject.

At 10 AM, students attend Hindu Religion classes for their respective age group. Jain students attend Jain Religion classes.

At 11 AM, students attend one of the seven language classes as per their preference of language. Gujarati, Hindi, Sanskrit, Tamil and Telugu language classes are further split into 2 or 3 sections based on proficiency of students. Kannada and Marathi have one section each. Bharatiya Vidyalaya is open to start another Indian language provided 6 or more students register.

On a few Sundays, Culture classes are scheduled instead at 10 AM and 11 AM. The schedule for the year is finalized in advance.

At noon, students attend Aarati upstairs. After the Aarati, over 30 students attend the music (group singing) class. About the same number of students participate in Geeta chanting classes at the same time.

Students enthusiastically participate in the program conducted by hardworking volunteers. Students and parents find the Bharatiya Vidyalaya program engaging and beneficial.

From 10 AM to 12 PM, about 10 parents join the Bhagavad Geeta discussion group. Dedicated volunteers knowledgeable on the subject moderate the group. The group is currently studying Bhagavad Geeta chapter 2. Chapter two is often deemed as a summary to the entire Geeta. In this chapter, Arjuna accepts the position as a disciple of Lord Krishna

Lord Krishna explains that just as the embodied soul continuously passes from childhood to youth to old age, similarly, at the time of death, the soul passes into another body. The wise are not deluded by this.

Simultaneously at 10 AM, up to 20 parents attend a meditation session for parents.

Volunteers

Bharatiya Vidyalaya program for 2023 is run by about 50 teaching volunteers and 10 non-teaching volunteers. All volunteers actively maintain their required compliance as per the law for volunteering in Pennsylvania. During Q4, the focus was acquainting students with the basics of religion, culture and language as per their level of understanding.

New volunteers in their first one or two years are paired up with experienced volunteers for orientation.

Senior Students

As part of the *Senior Student* program, 9th grade and above students are provided an opportunity to learn how to teach a class by pairing them up with adult volunteers. This year, 11 students have been assigned the role of *Senior Students*. A *Senior Student* helps with teaching one subject (for example, Religion) and attends classes for the other two subjects as a student (in this example, Culture and Language).

Library

Bharatiya Vidyalaya library was shut down for two years during the COVID period. A dedicated group of volunteers reactivated the library a year ago. Parents borrow books from the library for their family.

Expenses

Bharatiya Vidyalaya volunteers are extremely conservative with expenses. The only significant expense is the cost of text books and bag, which is less than 10% of the fee parents pay. Hindi, Sanskrit and Tamil are relatively more expensive books. These more expensive books are paid for by parents. Additionally, volunteers and parents donate generously to cover most, if not all expenses for occasional food sponsoring, web site hosting and other expenses required for running the Vidyalaya activities.
