## Religious Committee - Hindu

#### January 2024

On the 1st of January, New Year's Day the temple was open all day long. In the morning Srinivas Kalyanam was celebrated with great pomp as is the New Year's day tradition after the recital of Thiruvempavai for Lord Shiva. Satyanarayan Puja was also performed in the evening for New Year's day followed by Shiva abhishekam..

On Saturday January 6th, due to inclement weather the Irumudi Kettu was done around 2 pm along with the mandala puja. On January 7. Sunderkand parayan was performed. Hanuman Jayanthi was celebrated on 10th Jan. Hanuman Chalisa was chanted 5 times with the grand Puja. Kudaravalli was celebrated on the morning of January 12th.

On Saturday January 13, after the Balaji abhishekam, Thiruppaliezhuchi & Thiruppavai recital was done followed by Andal/Goda Kalyanam performed on the temple floor. The function was well attended by devotees. Bhogi/Lohri was also celebrated on January 13. In the morning around 7 AM the Bhogi fire and puja was done outside the temple. There was a huge turn out of Devotees around the Lohri bonfire in the temple compound.

On January 14th Makara Sankranti / Pongal was celebrated in the morning. In the evening Makarajjothi Puja was done to mark the conclusion of Mandalam.

We had a huge turnout for Saamuhik Sri Ram Mandir Prana Prathista on 21st of January starting from 9 PM till the next morning. More than 1000 devotees came for this special event. The temple floors were decorated with lamps and Rama Flags. Special arrangements were made to telecast the live event of Ram Mandir celebrations in Ayodhya. We had special abhishek for Ramparivar and Puja. We had Ram bhajans from different groups at the event.

We had Thai Poosam on January 25th. It is believed that on this day, Goddess Parvathi presented a lance to Lord Muruga to kill the demon army of Tarakasura. Thai poosam is a celebration of the victory of good over evil. This event was well attended by devotees, they carried milk pots and kavadi around the temple in procession, followed by Lord Murugan abishek chanting the Kandar shasti kavacham (kavacham means to shield from all sufferings and agony). This month was filled with Special events and spiritual moments also.

#### February 2024

After all puja's & celebrations of the new year, the month of February was a relaxed month for the priests.

Other than monthly & weekly pujas not many festivals fell in this month.

As usual, the month began with the chants of "SUNDERKAND" the fifth chapter of the "Ramayana". The Devotees group, who gather on the first Sunday chanted the sunderkand on the beats of dholak & manjira spreading auspiciousness all around the temple. The Group that gathers to chant together is getting bigger hence leaving the temple hall with positive vibrations. Such is the power of chanting together.

During the second week of February, Vasanth Panchami which is also known as Basanth Panchami or Shree Panchami was celebrated. As per Hindu scriptures, it is believed that Goddess Saraswati was born on this auspicious day. So, this day is considered as the best day to perform all the religious activities and perform puja to the Goddess. Devotees gathered with their family to seek blessings of the Goddess. Special arrangements were made by the priests so each family could perform puja.

18th February, different Bhajan groups got together for a mesmerizing evening of Ram Lalla bhajans Accompanied by dhol / tabla / manjira. Ram devotees from Sruti group also sang Thyagaraja compositions.

Nitya & weekly Abhishekams & pujas took place regularly.

#### March 2024

Maha Shiva Ratri was on Friday, March 8th this year. An elaborate program was planned as we do every year. At 6PM children sang sweet bhajans. At 7 PM the Maha Mrityunjay Abhishekam and Puja by sponsors commenced. It was very well attended and all the spots were packed with devotees. From 9:15PM to 10:15PM devotees sang bhajans to Lord Shiva. At 10:15PM the priests started the Rudrabhishekam of the Moola Murti. This was followed by Uttar Puja at 11:30PM and Archana. At midnight the Maha mangal aarti was sung by priests and devotees. Devotees were able to offer abhishekam to the Ustav Shivling from 5PM to 11:30PM. The function was very well attended by devotees, many of whom stayed back till the Mangal aarti was completed after midnight.

Meenakshi Kalyanam was performed on Sunday, March 24 at 10AM. The Kalyanam was performed very well by the temple priests and devotees enjoyed the divine atmosphere.

Holi this year was on Sunday, March 24. Satyanarayan Puja was first conducted by the priests in the temple hall upstairs from 5:30PM to 7PM. From 7:30PM onwards Holika dahan was performed. About 300 devotees at least attended the Holika dahan, each one making small offerings to the sacred fire. Besides these all other regular temple functions were performed at the temple.

Jains had weekly puja of Adinath Bhagwan every Sunday in first quarter 2024. We also had monthly Bhavna on first Wednesday of each month and Santra puja on second Sunday of each month during the first quarter. There is daily aarti at noon and 7 pm every day for Mahavir Swami, Parshvanath Bhagwan and Adinath Bhagwan. We are looking forward to Mahavir Jayanti and 18 Abhishek program scheduled for Saturday, April 7.



196 students registered for 2023-24 Bharatiya Vidyalaya program (August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2023 thru May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2024), the 19<sup>th</sup> year of successful operation of Bharatiya Vidyalaya. The number of students this year is about the same (97%) as pre-COVID.

#### A Typical Bharatiya Vidyalaya Sunday

Students start their Sundays at 9:30 AM with Yoga led by experienced volunteers. This is followed by prayers and Bhagavad Geeta chanting. Parents are encouraged to join the morning assembly along with students. Occasionally, a student makes a 5-10 minutes presentation in the morning assembly on a Religion, Culture or Language topic.

At 10 AM, students attend Hindu Religion classes for their respective age group. Jain students attend Jain Religion classes.

At 11 AM, students attend one of the seven language classes as per their preference of language. Gujarati, Hindi, Sanskrit, Tamil and Telugu language classes are further split into 2 or 3 sections based on proficiency of students. Kannada and Marathi have one section each. Bharatiya Vidyalaya is open to start another Indian language provided 6 or more students register.

On a few Sundays, Culture classes are scheduled instead at 10 AM and 11 AM. The schedule for the year is finalized in advance.

At noon, students attend Aarati upstairs. After the Aarati, over 30 students attend the music (group singing) class. About the same number of students attend Geeta chanting classes at the same time.

Students enthusiastically participate in the program conducted by hardworking volunteers. Students and parents find the Bharatiya Vidyalaya program engaging and beneficial.

From 10 AM to 12 PM, about 10 parents join the Bhagavad Geeta discussion group. Dedicated volunteers knowledgeable on the subject moderate the group. The group is currently studying Bhagavad Geeta chapter 2. Chapter 2 is deemed as a summary to the entire Geeta by some philosophers. In verse 48 of the chapter, Bhagavan Krishna defines Yoga.

#### Volunteers

Bharatiya Vidyalaya program for 2023-4 has been run by over 50 teaching volunteers and 10 non-teaching volunteers. All volunteers actively maintain their required compliance as per the law for volunteering for children in Pennsylvania. During Q1, the focus was training students for Culture Day (March 17<sup>th</sup>), Religion Day (April 21<sup>st</sup>) and Language Day (May 19<sup>th</sup>).

New volunteers in their first two years are paired up with experienced volunteers for orientation.

#### **Senior Students**

As part of the *Senior Student* program, 9<sup>th</sup> grade and above students are provided an opportunity to learn how to teach a class by pairing them up with adult volunteers. This year, 11 students have been assigned the role of *Senior Students*. A *Senior Student* helps with teaching one subject (for example, Religion) and attends classes for the other two subjects as a student (in this example, Culture and Language).

#### Library

A dedicated group of volunteers manage Bharatiya Vidyalaya library. Parents borrow books from the library for their children and themselves.

#### **Expenses**

Bharatiya Vidyalaya volunteers are extremely conservative with expenses. The only significant expense is the cost of text books and school-bag, which is less than 10% of the fee parents pay. Hindi, Sanskrit and Tamil are relatively more expensive books. These more expensive books are paid for in full by parents. Additionally, volunteers and parents donate generously to cover most, if not all expenses for occasional food sponsoring, web site hosting and other expenses required for running the Vidyalaya activities.
